



## HISTORY AND CURRENT PORTFOLIO

- Long history of support for PA management, tourism
- 2014 redesign away from ecotourism due to AHA
- Private sector engagement critical for success



 Integrated CDCS spread Biodiversity efforts across Resilience and Systems DOs




#### Current portfolio built around:

- » Resilience of ecosystems and the communities they support
- » Conservation of key species and enterprises they support
- » Strengthening systems for conservation and NRM








#### HISTORY AND CURRENT PORTFOLIO

- 2014: USAID/Zambia biodiversity portfolio approved
- Activities funded since 2014: WCPP, NLEP & CWP; Buy-ins to DOI-PAPA & ILRG
- NLEP: CE interventions but no TOC during design
  - Community game ranching, bee keeping, horticulture, Community Conservation Banks (COCOBAs)
- CE outcomes:
  - 22 COCOBAs with 69% women
  - Members agree to conservation compatible businesses only
  - Only mentoring and financial mgt training provided to groups
- Key outcomes measured: # of income streams; income changes & conservation perceptions

## OUTCOMES AND LEARNING ALONG THE CE THEORY OF CHANGE



#### WHAT THE INCOMING FSO NEEDS TO KNOW

#### Lessons learned to inform new programs:

- Market linkages and partnerships with the private sector key for success
- Community buy-in and steady flow of benefits important for sustenance
- CE provide an opportunity for promoting women leadership in conservation

#### **Activities in Design**

 Integrated activities under the HEARTH GDA - Integrating Biodiversity Conservation, WASH, FtF, Mother & Child Health Activities in two priority landscapes - Kafue and Luangwa

# When you have moved to new posts, what is the most helpful thing someone has done for you?

- Sent me a reading list, including fiction, local news and music criticism- espcially helpful for posts that operate in a language other than English
- Introductions to relevant officials, stakeholders, CSOs to get a big picture understanding ot the country and sector context.
- It was great to receive a summary of my portfolio and then have regular meetings to go over the portfolio for several weeks, even months, after I arrive for it to really settle in.
- I was able to meet face to face for a nice, long meeting with my predecessor to talk through her portfolio and ask any questions I had.
- A clear and concise briefing on the current portfolio, the underlying issues and the trends
- Understanding of the political economy, especially incentives for different stakeholder groups.
- What was working well and what was not working well, and why? I got some good answers to these basic questions from my colleagues in the mission and AID/W. Those lessons learned and best practices that were very useful to me.

#### **Conservation Enterprises**

Conservation enterprises approaches are defined by a development hypothesis (theory of change) that if income is increased through conservation enterprises, then participants will discontinue environmentally unsustainable activities, leading to reductions to threats to the environment.
