CI's REDD+ Readiness Capacity Building Support

Main types of Capacity Building:



1. Forest carbon project development training



2. REDD+ Readiness Planning



3. Training and ToT for community & Indigenous Peoples' representatives and organizations



Over 27 trainings with >880 people in 15 countries trained so far

1. Forest Carbon Project Development

- **Objective:** introduce project developers to the basics of climate change science, policy markets, and project development
- Originally developed for CI country staff working on site-level projects
- **Audience:** broad mix NGO partners, government reps, and other stakeholders
- Delivered 10 trainings to >350 people in Brazil, Costa Rica, Peru, DR Congo, Ecuador, Indonesia, Liberia, EG and Madagascar from 2007-2010
- Respond to requests from CI field programs and partners, or project opportunities

How do we run the course?

Can be done in 3-5 days, including field visit (3-days min suggested)

Four modules developed:

1. Basics of climate change science, policy and markets
2. Introduction to REDD+ and the role of forests
3. Forest carbon concepts, drivers, strategies to reduce defor
4. REDD+ projects: design, management, implementation

Guest lectures to explore national & local context

Small group discussions to share experience or do exercises

Course certificate & material provided at the end

Online Introductory Course on REDD+

Objectives: increase understanding and engagement in REDD+ policy negotiations at the national and international levels.

- Provides a basic level of understanding regarding the concept of REDD+
- Consists of 4 modules covering the essential aspects of the scientific, technical, political, financial, social and environmental issues related to REDD+ design and implementation
- Provides a course certificate to participants for successful completion

2. REDD Readiness trainings

- **Objective**: promote national level dialogues on participation in REDD+
- Prepare for participation in mechanisms such as World Bank's Forest Carbon Partnership Facility (FCPF)
- **Audience**: key government officials and CSO working on REDD+ Readiness
- Topics include:
 - Intro to REDD+ Readiness,
 - international readiness initiatives,
 - examples of national strategies,
 - technical MRV issues,
 - working sessions (roadmap)
- CI has co-facilitated events in Peru, Guatemala, Liberia, Suriname, Ecuador, Chiapas-Mexico, Equatorial Guinea



3. Community-level trainings

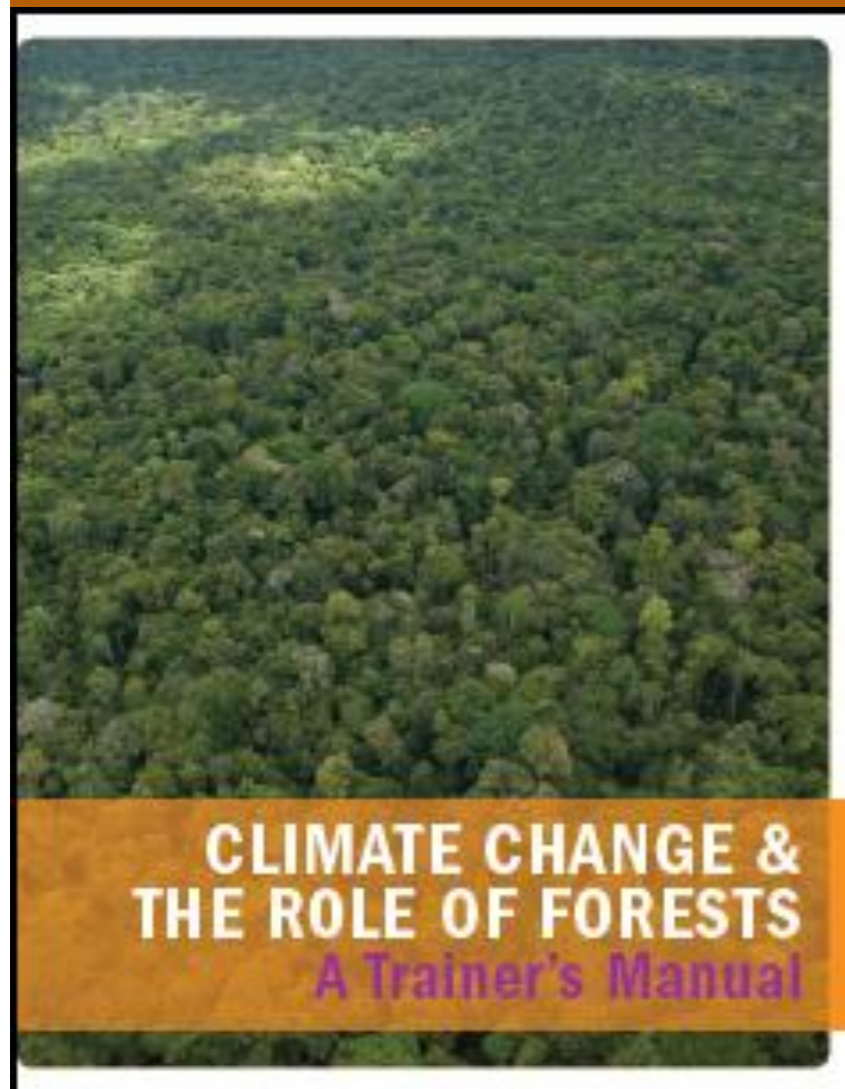
Objective: strengthen understanding & participation of Indigenous Peoples and Local Communities in climate change issues related to forests and adaptation

Audience: Indigenous Peoples and Local Communities leaders

- Piloted in DR Congo April 2009
- Evolved into a Training of Trainers course across CI divisions
- 9 trainings completed, >280 people trained
- ToT materials produced including presentations, community level guidebooks, and training manuals

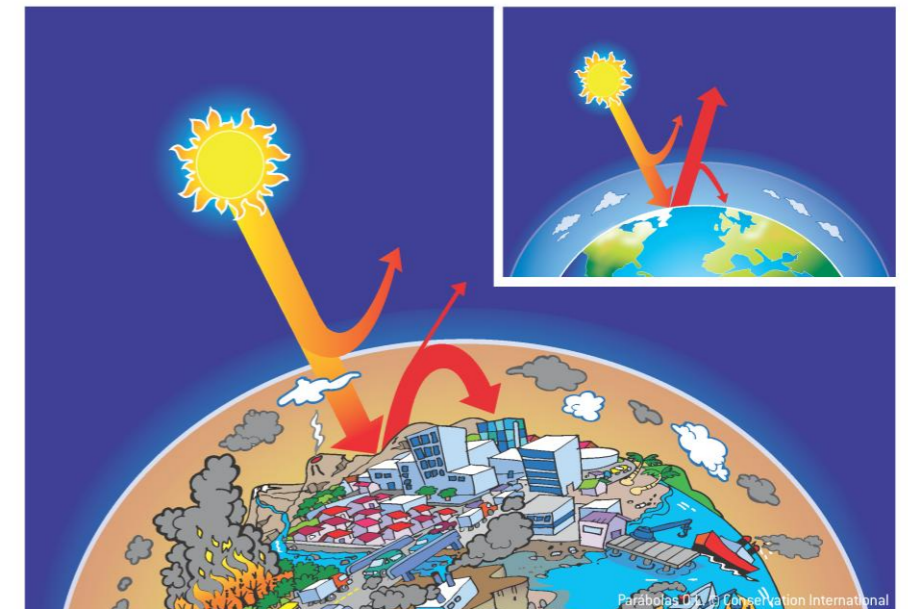
