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Objectives

- Expansion of Protected Areas to six million hectares.
- Protected areas with **new** categories and governance types including local communities.
- Ecosystem Services from PA to contribute to poverty alleviation and sustainable development.

International partners:


Donors'community (USAID, World Bank, KFW, GTZ), NGOs (WWF, WCS, DWCT, MBG)

- Political and legal framework
- 38 new protected areas created in a participatory way
- New types of governance
- Guide/Tools for PA promoters and managers
- Stewardship approach: CBNRM, Participatory Ecological Monitoring...
- Financing mechanism: PES, Ecotourism...





LESSON LEARNED 1

The effectiveness of the communication system is the basis of engagement of communities

LESSON LEARNED 2

Ownership of the PA agenda takes time beyond cycles of projects, need to ensure continuity with a mid/long term support strategy

LESSON LEARNED 3

Sustainability of protected areas is dependent upon the availability of livelihood options for communities

Future Plans

- Implementation of a **capacity building program** for governance structures
- Development of multisectoral partnerships for an integrated land-use planning
