


Objectives

- to resolve conflicts over natural resources
- to elaborate an institutional framework to manage natural resources.
- to provide training on leadership, governance, business and financial management

RESULTS

- An integrated Natural Resource management plan, with clear zoned areas
- Formulation of appropriate incentive systems to accelerated adoption of and sustainable investment in best fit innovations for natural resource management e.g. Tourism related enterprises generating revenues and creating employment opportunities
- Engagement and commitment of private sector
- Establishment of institutional framework to manage natural resources.
- Training and capacity building on leadership, governance, business and financial management
- Up-scaling and out-scaling of successful innovations and community empowerment in NRM





Lessons learnt

- NRM and land use plans need to be located in a wider conservation context & linked to the wider conservation / NRM targets
- Need to have important linkages that captures wider partnership that includes the private sector
- Good governance is key to the success of NRM/land use plan implementation and conservation





Future plans

- Continue to focus the program to institute propoor conservation in a way that furthers natural resource conservation, mitigates/reduces natural resource conflicts, empowers disadvantaged groups (e.g. women) and reduces poverty
- Engage more private sector partnership
